## Molokai Protocol and Good Neighbor Policy.

Escorts for the Molokai to Oahu canoe races are to escort paddlers back to Oahu. The boaters must adhere to the following rules.

- 1. Observe a no wake (less than 5 mph) speed within 500 yards of any shoreline. There have been several instances of speeding escort boats almost hitting divers.
- No fishing, diving, Opihi picking or harvesting any shellfish or any such resources in the coastal waters off Molokai, as well as no hunting. If you are caught breaking these rules you will not be allowed to escort in future races and you will be exposed through the Molokai social media, virtually banning you from ever returning to Molokai on good terms.
- 3. No camping on private property or non-designated camping areas, including Make Horse Beach. The Molokai Police Department will be sending officers to cite unpermitted camping.
- 4. You must pick up your trash and take it with you.
- 5. Do not leave human waste on the shores of Molokai.
- 6. THERE WILL BE NO CAMPING on the beach or on the old hotel property. PLEASE respect this requirement from the hotel property and RESPECT all public access to the beach.
- 7. Overnight boaters need to stay in Hale o Lono overnight. THERE WILL BE NO BOATS ALLOWED TO ANCHOR IN FRONT OF THE KALUAKOI RESORTS. The shores surrounding the resort are protected reefs. PLEASE MAKE SURE YOUR BOAT CAPTAINS ARE AWARE OF THIS.
